



Nigeria: The Zaria Massacres and the Role of the Military

Friday 25 July was a fateful day in Nigeria this year. One of the 50 plus nation-wide annual demonstrations in support of the Palestinians was brutally attacked by the Nigerian military. Some 33 people were killed, with some dying in custody. At least two more were killed the next day in a similar attack on the funeral preparations.'

This panel presents the report of IHRC's fact-finding mission to Zaria, and presents eye-witness testimony and analysis from key people involved.

As the report finds, there are serious systemic issues regarding the role of the military in Nigeria and the curtailment of basic rights.
