Standing Together accomplishes its goals of minimizing costs and spending every possible dollar on achieving their mission by using a staff made up predominantly of volunteers, sending newsletters via email rather than traditional mailings and employing modern marketing strategies. New programs and initiatives are constantly being implemented by Standing Together in order to serve more soldiers, better assist the community of Sderot and increase the number of people who are able to express appreciation to those who truly deserve it. Our brave young soldiers are outside, guarding our borders for 12-18 hour shifts. They are guarding our checkpoints and keeping our people safe but they are shivering. The costs of military equipment has gone up, so have the worldwide threats to our nation. The IDF must choose to spend their limited funds on thing like technology and tanks, not state of the art thermal underwear and gloves that allow the soldiers to be warm and trigger-ready at the same time. Parents all over the world provide their children with the winter clothing they need. Parents who cannot provide these things have organizations to turn to for help. Our soldiers should be as important to us as our own children. Many army units do not allow for one soldier to receive these items from their families if others are not able to. Standing Together provides for the entire unit according to the needs as recognized and approved by the IDF. So far this winter, we have purchased and distributed over 4000 pairs of gloves, over 1000 fleece jackets, over 1000 thermals and over 1000 neck warmers. We truly appreciate all the donations we have received that have allowed us to get to this point. The winter is far from over and the requests are continuing to arrive regularly. We have decided to forgo all other fundraising projects in order to focus on meeting these needs. Hopefully in the coming weeks we will be able to double what we have already distributed.

Bringing Equipment to the Soldiers

Since the beginning of Operation Protective Edge, Standing Together has been leading the effort to bring the soldiers what they need. We work in close coordination with senior IDF commanders who we have made connections with over the years to make sure that soldiers are receiving the items and equipment that most benefit them. We have been making daily trips to the camps and bases surrounding Gaza with a wide assortment of things for the soldiers, graciously provided by our donors. Aside from the food and drinks that we regularly provide, there are pieces of equipment that we've been giving the soldiers that truly help them in their mission. Below are some of the more common items that Standing Together has brought to the soldiers.



LED Headlamps

The tunnels that Hamas has built to infiltrate into Israel is indeed a disturbing turn of events. The IDF soldiers are being given headlamps, donated by our supporters, to clear out these dark tunnels and destroy them. In addition, crews loading tanks with ammunition were able to free up both hands

Knee Pads

Being in the field is tough on a soldier's body, especially their knees. They are not issued by the IDF to every combat soldier, but are such an essential part of a foot soldier's combat gear, they are

typically purchased by the soldiers themselves. A pair of knee pads alleviates the pain and stress on the soldiers, and they are most welcome when we bring them out to them.

Dri-Fit T-Shirts

Sweat from the constant heat in the desert can quickly drench the soldiers, making their uniforms scratchy and uncomfortable. T-shirts made from a special material that whisks the sweat away from the skin makes it easier for the soldiers – weighted down with heavy combat gear – to spend extended time out in the heat.

Socks

Soldiers are on their feet most of the day, whether it's on combat patrol or duties in camp. Having clean, dry socks is the most critical element of any soldier's uniform. We bring the soldiers IDF regulation socks that are rugged enough to withstand the rigors of being worn in combat boots for extended periods of time, at the same time keep the soldier's feet free from moisture.

Multi-Purpose Tools

For small fix-it jobs, these tools are invaluable. As a combination pliers, knife, can opener and other small tools, the soldiers treasure these handy little devices for all sorts of tasks, including keeping the rest of their equipment in good shape.

Sunglasses

These simplest of all items are the most appreciated by the soldiers. We all know how bright the summer sun can be, but it's the blowing sand that causes the most trouble for the soldiers, and it is these sunglasses that have made the difference. The soldiers who patrol the desert sands outside Gaza must remain constantly vigilant, and more than one have told us that it was their sunglasses that prevented a potentially tragic situation.

Through your donations, we are continuing to bring soldiers these and other essential equipment to help them protect themselves, the communities in the South, and throughout Israel.

A Personal IDF Story That Will Send Shivers Down Your Spine

During the summer of 2006 I was the director of a summer camp in Israel. I remember it being a scorching hot day and we were all counting down the minutes till pool time. I stopped by the soccer field and kicked around the ball with some campers and then stopped by the baseball field where I took a couple of swings. The sun was shining and the kids were having a blast and then everything changed.

My phone began ringing and thinking it was a parent of a camper who wanted to know how their kid was doing. I answered in English with a happy "Hello?" On the other side of the line was a woman who was speaking in very fast Hebrew and her orders were clear and concise.

Israel was in the middle of the Second Lebanon War and I knew it was only a matter of time till I would be getting the call. Although I was expecting to be drafted, when I actually got the call a wave of fear mixed with a huge feeling of pride overcame me. I ran to find the owner of the camp to quickly relay the news and then ran frantically to find my three kids who were playing joyfully with their bunk.

Each of them were in the middle of a great game and they wanted to continue having fun. But daddy had to go...

As they climbed into the car with very long faces, I began to explain to them that I received a call from the army. They were too young to understand the consequences but I do think they felt proud more than scared that their Abba (daddy) was going to fight to protect Israel. As I drove up to the house I ran inside and started throwing gear into my duffel bag. My wife, who was much calmer than me, said, "Relaxt Where do you think you're going? Lebanon?" I turned, smiled and said, "that is exactly where I am going." She was still calmer than me and told me to relax and that everything would be okay.

My bags were packed, my uniform was on, my boots were tied and within 2 hours I went from fun Camp Director to IDF combat soldier who was about to face Hizbullah terrorists. I said my goodbyes, gave my kids and my wife a huge hug then took each of my children and gave them the traditional blessing a father gives his children on Friday night.

After arriving at my unit's pick-up point, I had several hours to think as the taxi that was sent to take me and several others raced to the Northern border. I cannot put down on paper the thoughts that were going through my mind, they are just too frightening for me to write. If I ever meet you in person I will relay exactly what was going through my mind and in the deepest part of my soul.

The trip seemed to take forever but once I arrived at my base, time jumped into warp speed. I received my weapon, met my unit and before I knew it we were running, shooting and going through exercises that were designed to get us ready for what we might face. After a day of training we were given our orders and told that within several hours we would be entering Lebanon.

Some guys took the time to rest while others checked their gear. I called home to let everyone know I was okay and sent an SMS that read, "Don't worry, Am Yisrael Chai" (*the nation of Israel is alive*). I then decided to go to the Shul (synagogue) on the base and talk to God. The words that came out of my mouth were emotional and somewhat scary. Again, I cannot put on paper the content of my discussion with God, but the words came from very deep within my soul and if I ever meet you I will be happy to describe them to you.



We were off! All geared up and in formation, we began our trek of 30 KM into Lebanon. Whether it was the missiles that hit the area (where we were satting just moments before the explosion) or the fact that my vest and knapsack were completely destroyed from shrapnel. I lost count of how many times we had a close call.

Several of my platoon mates were mjured and one was killed and the evacuation of injured friends was probably one of the hardest things I have ever done.

At one point, one of my platoon mates told me I was hit. I reached back to feel water dripping out of my vest and my mind was racing with the worst thoughts one can possibly imagine. If I was hit by shrapnel or a bullet and was in shock, it meant I had only a couple of minutes to get it removed so I was frantically reaching back, feeling for an entry hole. Out of the back of my vest I felt a sharp piece of steel and as I ripped it out, I found myself holding a huge piece of shrapnel that must have blown through my vest and stopped before completely cutting me in half.

After a week of fighting, we started our long walk home completely exhausted, both physically and emotionally. We had a 30 KM all-night trek and we were at the end of our strength. When we finally made it over the border, I bent down to kiss the ground. I am not sure if it was a sign of how much I love Israel or to thank God I made it out, but it doesn't really matter. I was back and we had to re-energize and get ready for our next mission. Even after we crossed over the border, we had to walk another 2 KM into Israel due to the fact that buses would not drive up in fear of missile fire.

There was one truck however that did meet us at the border. The Standing Together jeep with the attached trailer opened up its doors and started giving out food, drinks, new clothing and gear. We were shocked and ecstatic but nothing prepared us for what happened next. The driver of the jeep pulled out a sack filled with hundreds of letters from people around the world who sent their moral support and encouragement. There is no doubt in my mind that the food, drinks, gear and especially those letters gave us the strength to go back in for our final tour of duty in Lebanon.

Here Is Why IDF Soldiers HATE Checkpoints

Several years ago I was traveling to the States for a speaking engagement/fundraiser for the IDF. I was flying from NY to Boston and on the plane I was seated next to a middle-aged woman. I guess she took notice that I was reading a Hebrew book and asked if I was Jewish. I smiled and answered with a warm yes and she followed up with a "So, where are you from?" I smiled again and answered, "Israel". That is when our conversation took a sour turn. Her warm smile turned into a frown as she explained that she too is Jewish but will go nowhere near Israel. I figured it was the security situation that she was scared of, so I assured her that the situation is not as bad as CNN might make it look.

BOY WAS I WRONG!

She was not worried about the security situation even in the slightest bit. She looked me straight in the eye and asked, how I can live in a country where the military targets children and murders innocent people for the sake of murdering?

I took a VERY deep breath and before answering I asked her once again if she ever actually visited Israel. She answered with a quick no and that's when I let loose. When I told her that she happens to be sitting next to an active IDF sergeant who served in Lebanon, Jenin, Gaza and across every centimeter of the West Bank her facial expression was priceless!

You Criticize The IDF? What Would You Do?

Susan (my flight friend's name) gave me a stern look and asked me how I sleep at night. This is how the conversation continued.

"Ya know what Susan, you're right! So let me give you a scenario and YOU tell me what you would have done. You are stationed in a base bordering Gaza, your mission is to stop any terrorist activity and to halt any possible terrorist infiltration into Israel.

There is a 200 meter buffer zone which is a military closed zone. Just a week ago two Islamic terrorists with knapsacks entered the zone and when the IDF tried to stop them, they detonated the bomb that was in their knapsacks.

The 200 meter zone is a kill zone; no one is allowed in that zone and anyone who enters and does not heed IDF orders is deemed to be a terrorist threat.

You start your shift and the orders are simple: if anyone enters the buffer zone you warn them to stop, if they ignore the orders you fire warning shots in the air and if again they ignore the order, you shoot the legs. If there is imminent danger of a suicide bomber, you shoot to kill.



If a terrorist detonates a bomb 200 meters out you might be injured by shrapnel, 150 meters you can get killed by flying shrapnel, 100 meters you lose your arms, 70 your legs, 60 and closer you DIE!

Five minutes into your shift you see an Arab shepherd and his young son walking 50 sheep and they enter the buffer zone at 200 meters, what do you do?

Susan thought for a second and responded with, "yell at them and tell them this is a military zone."

"That was a great idea, Susan and that's exactly what we did. The son who must have been no older than 15 gave us the finger, screamed ALLAH AKHBAR (God is great in Arabic, usually used for war cries) and continued walking towards us, deeper into the buffer zone – what do you do? They are now 170 meters away, if either of them have terrorist intentions you are already in danger!

Susan thought for another second and only when I reminded her that they are now 150 meters away did she

respond with, "Shoot warning shots in the air".

"That was another great idea, Susan and it is exactly what we did. The son then picked up his shirt and tapped his chest as if to say SHOOT ME and then once again shouted ALLAH AKHBAR and continued walking directly at us.

They are now 100 meters away, WHAT DO YOU DO, SUSAN?"

As Susan was scratching her head I raised my voice and said,

"THEY ARE 90 METERS AWAY! THERE GO YOUR ARMS!"

Susan was getting a little uncomfortable and then I raised my voice again and said,

"THEY ARE NOW 70 METERS AWAY and SCREAMING, "DEATH TO JEWS!" YOU JUST LOST YOUR LEGS, SUSAN, WHAT DO YOU DO?"

Susan feeling the pressure said "Order them to stop!"

"Susan, you already did that, they are now 60 meters from you, what do you do? If they blow up, YOU'RE DEAD! 50, 40 30"...

Susan was actually becoming very anxious and then jumped when I screamed,

"BOOM! You and your team are dead! Good job, Susan!"

Susan sat there quietly for a couple of seconds and then turned to me and asked if this really happened. I smiled and said yes, it happened to my unit in 2004. Then came the question, "What did you do?" she asked. It was the first time that Susan did not assume she knew what we in the IDF did and actually wanted to know the truth.

"What Did We Do, Susan? When the two came within 150 meters we warned them that if they do not stop we will be forced to shoot. When the boy picked up his shirt, my commander aimed his gun, aimed for the head OF ONE OF THE SHEEP and fired! The Arab boy took the sheep over his shoulders and they both backed out of the buffer zone."

Susan smiled as if to give me her approval and said that was a very smart thing to do. This time I was looking Susan straight in the eyes and explained that the next morning there were pictures all over the web of a dead sheep with headlines "IDF soldiers shoot sheep of peaceful Arab Shepherds!"

That was the end of our conversation. I am not sure if Susan changed her opinion about Israel but at least she received a small reality check. Israeli checkpoints are not in place in order to make life difficult for anyone. Checkpoints are a result of 66 years of Islamic terror that has no boundaries. My unit has caught children as young as 11 years old who were carrying homemade bombs in their knapsack. Not once and not twice have we encountered elderly Arabs sitting on the porch of a house, knowing that inside they are hiding Islamic






